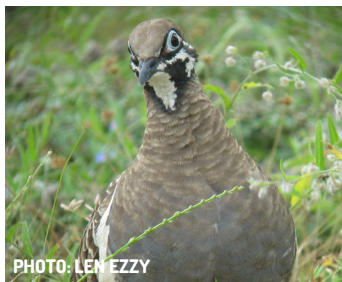

Weeds are a key threatening process for some of these species and landholders will learn how to manage weeds on their own land, to protect the habitat of these special plants and animals.
